From little things, big things grow!

In 1999 the Lions Club of Wagga Wagga South Wagga took on a project to run a fundraiser for a cancer care clinic in Wagga Wagga. At this stage there were no such clinics set up outside Australian Capital Cities. They ran an Art Union, and raised over \$200,000 and along with money from other community activities the centre was set up. John Howard, the then PM, heard about the clinic being established and decided there and then to set this type of clinic up in major centres throughout Australia.

The Macquarie Valley Lions Clubs Mobility Project (MVLCMP)

- The MVLCMP started in 1998 when the three Dubbo Lions Clubs were brought together by District Governor of the time, Norm Hawkins, who had realised the increasing need for the provision of a number of HART walkers in the area. The group now includes 7 clubs along the Macquarie River
- To date more than forty mobility devices have been funded through MVLCMP, around \$550,000.00 worth!

CITRUS FOR THE SOUTH 2022
A LIONS CLUB PROJECT

Lions Clubs are asking residents of Whangarei & Districts to check out their citrus trees, **in particular sweet oranges & lemons** for fruit to send to the people of Christchurch, Dunedin & Clyde + Districts.

COLLECTION POINTS SUNDAY 3rd JULY 2022.. 8:30am to 2pm.

Lions clubs Citrus Fruit for the South project

In July/ August each winter Whangarei and Districts Lions club along with Tutukaka Coast Lions in the mid north Island of New Zealand have collected citrus fruit from the community to be sent to the mid to lower South Island of New Zealand, where due to temperature and location they are unable to grow citrus in good quantities.



Lions also go out into the community, to pick the abundant ripe fruit from the trees of people who are no longer able to harvest or use it. The Lions club members have a drop off shed.

The fruit is sorted, any damaged fruit is removed and then packed into boxes to be transported south.



▶ The oranges, limes, lemons tangelos and grapefruit are sorted and packed into large fruit boxes ready for distribution around the lower to South Island Lions clubs. The amount available is growing each year and this year they have sent over 5.5 tonne South.



Clyde and Districts Lions club members collect the fruit, it is resorted after transport to remove any damaged fruit. Then packed into recycled grocery paper bags.

Clyde and District Lions belong to District 202F which is the furthest South District in New Zealand'



The food is packed into saved brown paper bags from the local grocery shop.
Fruit is distributed to the Elderly, rest homes and food banks.

The Clyde Lions club deliver a large basket of homemade baking to Mainfreight transport as a big thank you for their generosity in supporting their community and this amazing Lions project.



Any damaged fruit is not wasted and is made into lemon honey and marmalade to be sold to the public with proceeds going to local Lions Club projects.

It quickly grew to include making port pillows (small rectangular cushions that attach to seat belts to provide cushioning to the chest and/or abdominal area for people with port/incision/surgical/trauma sites). We added personality cushions (round cushions with different faces) for children in hospital going through cancer treatment or craniofacial surgeries.

Our cushions were then also made for disadvantaged and vulnerable youth (0-18years) in various organisations

and foster care. It expanded to include making scrunchies, baby bibs and more for these children also.

In 2018, the project started another initiative, sorting and labeling children's books, and packing them into age

appropriate book bags for distribution. Youth literacy is a big problem and every child should have access to books. So these book bags are distributed to disadvantaged and vulnerable youth across SA.

Up until now, the project has supported over 7,700 individuals across SA.


