- Near sightedness
- Far sightedness

Signs and Symptoms

Behaviour

- Frequent blinking
- Sensitivity to light
- Squinting
- Holding a book too close
- Rubbing eyes
- Confusing colours
- Blurred or double vision
- Burning or itching eyes







KIDS NEED EYE TESTS TÕÕ!

- 1 in 5 Australian Children has an undetected vision
- About 80% of learning is through a child's eyes.
- Vision problems can have a profound effect on a child's development.
- Undiagnosed issues make learning difficult and such children may withdraw from classroom activity.
- Any problems need to be identified early and at as young an age as possible.
- Once recognised, these conditions are usually very easy to correct.
- All children should have regular eye examinations during their school years.


